

Central Board Appointed to Watch Over the Interests of Aborigines

1860 – 1869

Details

The Central Board Appointed to Watch Over the Interests of Aborigines came into being in 1860, as a result of an inquiry into Aboriginal welfare in Victoria in 1858. The Board was given statutory authority in 1869, with the passing of the Aborigines Protection Act 1869. At this time, the organisation became known as the Central Board for the Protection of Aborigines.
