Details

The Canterbury Bankstown City Library Image Collection contains images of the Canterbury Bankstown local government area held by Canterbury Bankstown City Library. The collection is being digitised and is available online as Canterbury Bankstown Remembers and via Trove. The collection includes images of the Protestant Federation Home which contains images of people and buildings at the New South Wales Protestant Federation Children's Home that was located in Garnet Street, Hurlstone Park.

Records

The smaller collection, Protestant Federation Home, consists of more than 160 group shots, portraits, building photographs and illuminated addresses from the New South Wales Protestant Federation Children's Home. Many of the subjects of the portraits from the Home have been identified.

Many of the photographs in this collection were donated to the Canterbury Bankstown City Library, or the Library was given access to their private photograph collections for copying.
