Details

Roelands is the name given to the Seven Hills farm property in Western Australia. Its history in out of home care began in 1932 when the Chandler Boys' Farm (1932-1937) was established there. The property was later used for the Roelands Native Mission Farm (1938-1975) and Roelands Village (1975-1984). In 2014, Roelands remains as a working farm which has no relationship to its history in out of home care. Prior to its use as the Changler Boys' Farm Roelands was purchased by Mr Albany Bell, a businessman and philanthropist who had a particular interest in supporting youth justice and child welfare programs in Western Australia.
